PMD Motor Body Repair Technical Requirements



(August 2021)

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Any prospective Motor Body Repairer (MBR) applying to join the PMD network of service providers will be required to adhere to the following set of technical requirements. Each applicant will need to complete the self-assessment form indicating the relevant compliance to these requirements and attaching supporting evidence where requested. Only service providers with full compliance to the technical requirements will be considered for a place in the PMD network. Upon successful appointment to the network, the MBR may be subject to a physical on-site inspection by a member of the PMD team within 6 months of the commencement of the service level agreement.

- 1.1. Dedicated, staffed, clean, usable reception area
- 1.2. Clearly marked and safe client parking
- 1.3. Relevant health and safety criteria in place
- 1.4. Fire extinguishers installed, demarcated and serviced according to the health and safety standards
- 1.5. Clearly visible emergency exit signs displayed
- 1.6. Necessary PPE equipment available and in working order

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4. Paint shop requirements

- 4.1. A fully functional spray booth complete with:
 - 4.1.1. Intake and exhaust system
 - 4.1.2. Air filters
 - 4.1.3. Heating system
 - 4.1.4. Control system, lighting switch, timer switch, temperature and pressure gauges
 - 4.1.5. Approved compliance certificate (supporting documentation required)
- 4.2. A fully functioning paint mixing room complete with:
 - 4.2.1. Mixer
 - 4.2.2. Calibrated scale
 - 4.2.3. Computer
- 4.3. Fully functioning spray-painting equipment complete with:
 - 4.3.1. Compressor with inline liquid and particle filer
 - 4.3.2. Compression in designated area
